Introduction and Purpose: In this survey, as a person of color in marine sciences, you will be asked about your experiences as a racially minoritized group in your education and career, your perceptions of barriers and opportunities specific to your career ambitions, and your thoughts on what would improve your experience in your field.

The purpose of the survey is to identify the barriers and opportunities for people of color in the marine sciences. Your responses may be shared among a group of collaborators who identify as Black women in marine sciences interested in research on the same topic.

Procedures: Completing this survey should take 10 to 15 minutes. Your participation is completely voluntary. We will also be collecting demographic information such as income, nationality, gender identity, sexual orientation, disability status, and parental/familial background. We will also ask questions about your experiences in the marine sciences related to isolation, discrimination, barriers, and enabling factors. Although questions cannot be skipped you can select a "Prefer not to answer" option if there is a question you would rather not answer.

Voluntariness and Confidentiality: You can withdraw from the survey at any time for any reason by closing the browser window. If you decide to withdraw from the survey, any responses you have provided up to that point will be deleted. While we may collect personal information about you (e.g., demographics), your identity will remain confidential. Although collected data may be made public or used for future research purposes, your identity will always remain confidential.

Risks and Benefits: There are no foreseeable risks associated with participating in this survey. While your participation in this survey may not benefit you directly, your responses will contribute to the growing body of research interrogating the disproportionate challenges faced by racial minorities in pursuing a career in the field of Science, Technology, Engineering, and Math (STEM).
