Many scientists are in a dual-career relationship. The opportunities and challenges this presents will be highlighted at this town hall sponsored by MPOWIR (Mentoring Physical Oceanography Women to Increase Retention). Dr. Kelly Ward, an expert in gender equality will discuss statistics on dual career couples and her research on managing two careers. A panel of oceanographic community members will share their strategies and experiences in finding opportunity, hiring and balancing two careers and respond to questions from participants.
